

Stubley Hollow Venue Rules

Car Parking

All club members must use the big car park that is through gates, past the arena. The other parking spots are for the Horse liveries. It doesn't matter what time you arrive at the club, please do not park where you shouldn't.

Dog Mess

Even though there is a public walkway through the venue and the equestrian fraternity own dogs any dog mess found on the venue is always attributed to the dog club. Please ensure that if your dog does its business that you pick up after it, inside or outside of the arena and **take it home with you**, please don't leave it for the trainers to take home.

Dogs on Leads

All dogs must be on leads at all times except when it is their turn to work on the course. When you fetch your dog from your car it must be walked into the venue on a lead.

Toilets

If you use the toilets, make sure that you turn off the light and that the door is closed after you.

NDDAC Health & Safety Rules

- All training done at the club is done so at your own risk. The club will not be held responsible for any injuries sustained to you or your dog.
- It is VITAL that you do not feed your dog for at least 4 hrs before coming to the club, ideally you should feed your dog its supper after training when you arrive home.
- Dogs working on the agility equipment must not wear, haltis, harnesses or muzzles for their own safety.
- **While the agility equipment is being set up & put away, all dogs must be either put in your car or placed in a down in the arena.**
- When the pegged agility equipment is packed away at the end of a training session, make sure that all the pegs are picked up & placed in the peg bucket, as these pose a risk to the horses that train in the arena.
- Agility can excite many dogs, so please be aware of this fact when stood waiting for your turn on the course. Be aware of your dogs "space", keep it on a short lead if it does not like other dogs in its face.
- When entering or exiting the arena, again be aware of dogs that are stood near the gate, they may not like your dog, or your dog may not like them.
